## Deaf/Hard of Hearing Program Student Recognition & Highlights - Celebrations!!

<u>Early Childhood (Total Communication & Auditory/Oral)</u> -5 students will either attend their resident school for kindergarten or will have mainstream opportunities with hearing peers. They have made great progress in language and academics this year. A special thank you to parents and staff for the support during their first year.

<u>First thru Third Grade Class</u> – Students made progress on following directions and using visual schedules. A student who had yet to be in school and had no language is now learning sign language and using a communication board.

<u>Third thru Fifth Grade</u> – Students have shown improvement in Math and Literacy. They have shown kindness to one another and encourage each other academically. We are very proud of their accomplishments!

<u>Junior High</u> – Students celebrated 100% participation in clubs, sports and activities. Every student improved their SEL assessment score from their pre-test scores in the Fall.

## Vision Program Student Recognition & Highlights - Celebrations!!

Addison Trail HS -This year a student used her leadership skills to start a LEGO club. The student pitched the idea and found a club sponsor and now the club meets every Tuesday. Several students participated in the Philosophy Club, Track Team, Art Club and Cheerleading. Addison Trail hosted a successful ISVI Goalball Clinic. Our athletes learned new skills, played several games, and had tons of fun with coaches and players. Parents even gave it a try!

<u>Transition</u> - This year a student shared his PowerPoint presentation and self-advocacy skills in obtaining a guide dog. Several students are competitively employed. The program has prepared students with employable skills to enter the workforce.

<u>Endless Possibilities</u> – College course work in the field of psychology for one student and two middle school students transitioning back to their resident school, all have demonstrated proficiency and utilized resources learned in our program.

## LADSE/Hinsdale South High School DHH Student Recognition – Let's Celebrate!

<u>Student Accomplishments</u> – The students completed: Community Service project with Plymouth Place, Rochester Institute of Technology Deaf Shark Tank Top Five Finalist, Deaf Olympics, and Special Olympics.
